

Bassett Street Hounds Day of Dance September 26, 2021

Arrive: Park (probably somewhere near Harvard Place) then walk to **Westcott Community Center** at 826 Euclid Ave, the corner of Westcott St. and Euclid Ave. Be at the Westcott Community Center by 11:30 am. When you arrive, assemble with other Morris dancers.

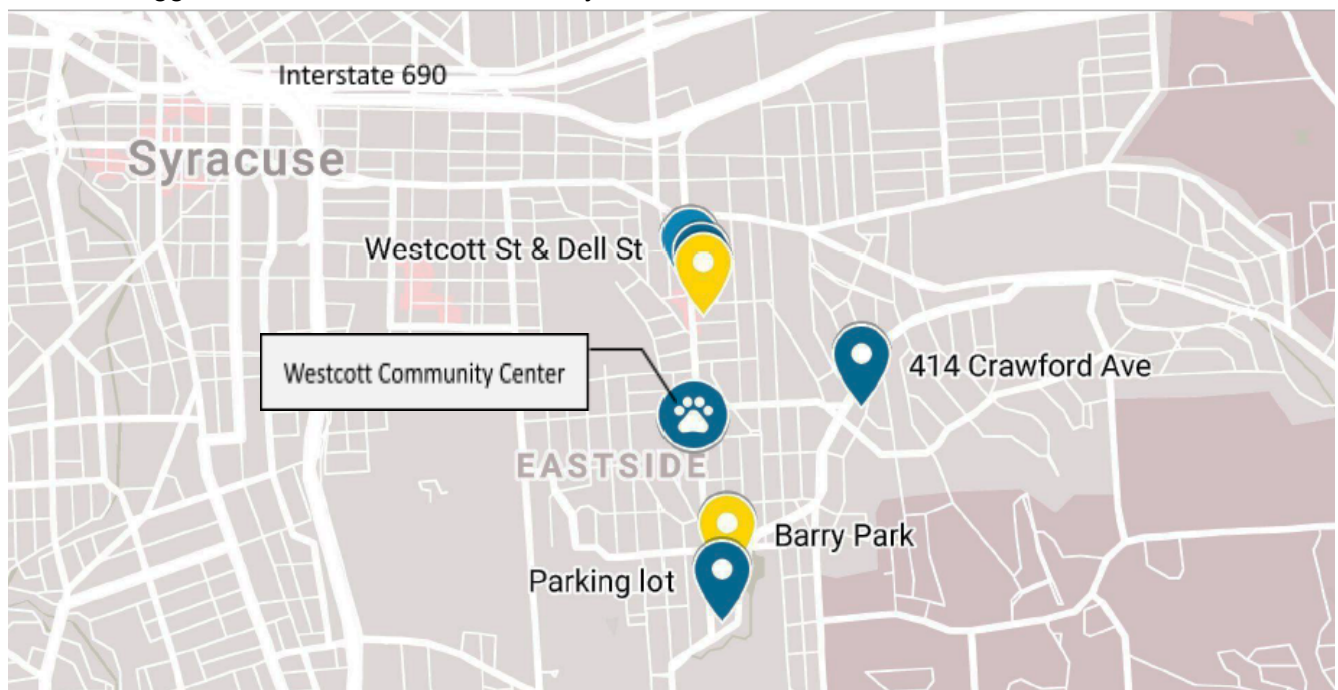
Parade: Noon-12:30 pm from Westcott Community Center. The parade proceeds north to the corner of Dell & Westcott St. We will alternate Winstering with periods of walking.

First stand: 12:50-1:20 pm Harvard Place stage, on the street by Recess Coffee

Lunch: 1:30-2:30 pm Enjoy the fair, get yourself some lunch, take a bathroom break

Second stand: 3-4 pm at Barry Park at the south end of Westcott St.

Social time: 4:15 pm – whenever Gin & tonic (with food) and the September pub sing. at Maria Hosmer-Briggs' house at 414 Crawford Av, Syracuse, NY

Getting to the Westcott Community Center for Parade Lineup

For our friends from Rochester:

Take the NYS Thruway to Exit 39, then take Interstate Route 690 East to Teall Ave (approx. 10 miles). Take Teall Ave. South, crossing Erie Blvd (NY-5). When you cross Erie, Teall becomes Columbus Ave. Turn left on E Genesee St, cross Westcott St, and turn right onto Cambridge, Allen, Fellows or Westmoreland and find a place to park. Allow plenty of time for parking and walking - you might need as much as ½ hour. After parking, walk to the Westcott Community Center for the parade lineup.

Bring what you will need from your arrival until 3 pm, or try to park where you can retrieve what you need. We will have a wagon to carry raincoats, etc during the parade - just one wagon, so try not to bring too much stuff. Susan Galbraith's car will be in the Handicapped parking lot near our first stand - if you need to stash something there after the parade, talk to Susan (315) 637-6686.

Parking: Your destination for the parade lineup is 826 Euclid Ave, the corner of Euclid Ave and Westcott St. This is several blocks south of the fair itself, so most of us find parking closer to the corner of Westcott St and Harvard Place and then walk to the Westcott Community Center. There is a parking lot at Levy Middle School on Fellows Ave by Harvard Pl, and street side parking in the residential areas around the fair. Pay close attention to even/odd parking signs -- This will be an "even" parking day. Parking rules are very strictly enforced in the neighborhood on the day of the fair!

Parking lot for People with Disabilities is behind the New Garden Restaurant at the corner of Dell & Westcott Street (near the top blue marker on this map).

Parade ends at corner of Dell & Westcott.

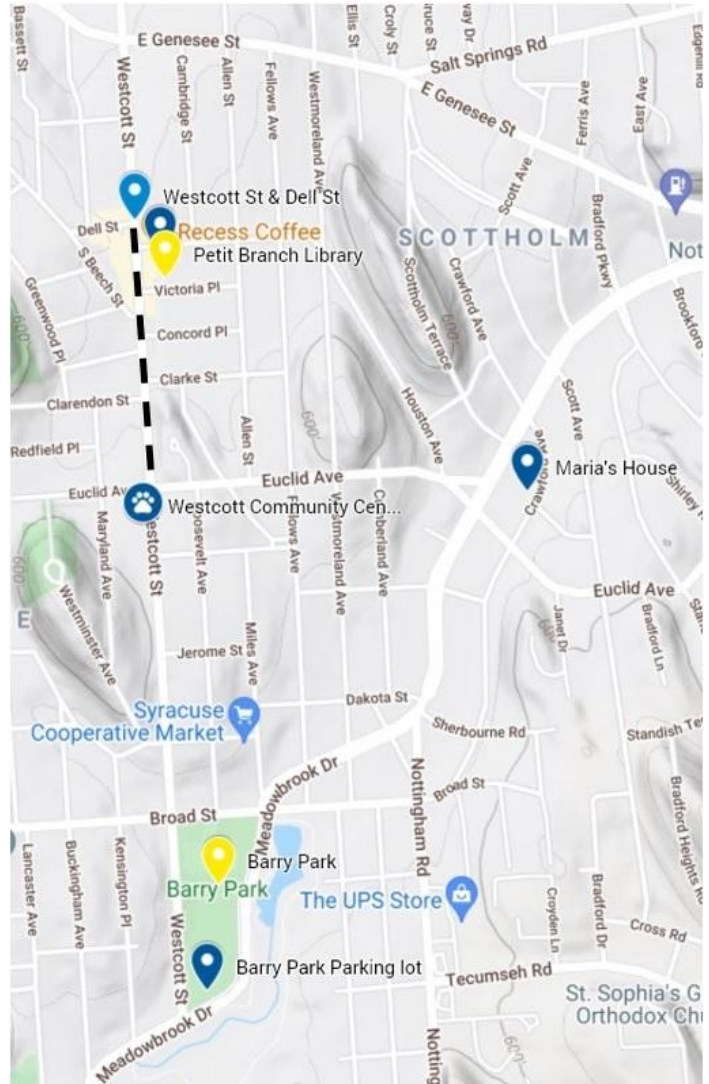
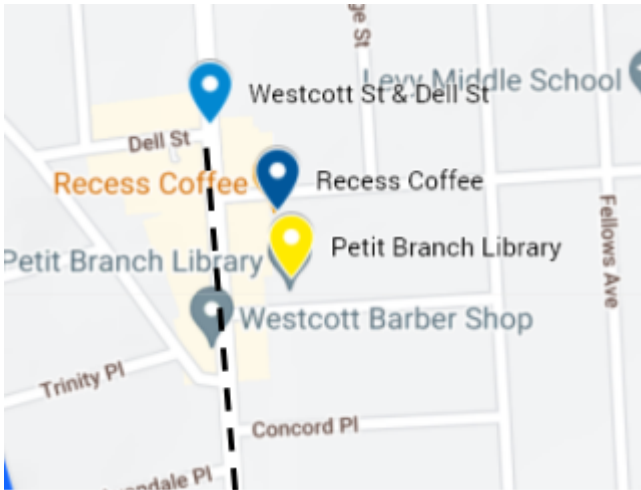


First Stand: We dance near Recess Coffee on Harvard Pl. from 12:50 – 1:20 pm.

Petit Branch Library. They also have public bathrooms.

This satellite photo is the official map from the fair organizers, showing road blockades, handicapped parking, and the stages. We will be dancing at the Harvard St “dance stage” except we dance in the street, not the parking lot that is the officially designated stage location.

Bathrooms:

We urge everyone to use a public bathroom or the Porta-potties at the Fair as there are no reliable bathrooms at Barry Park. There are restaurants and bars on Westcott St and some side streets around the fair. If you want to use one of their bathrooms, they may (not unreasonably) expect you to buy something. Petit Library on Victoria Place has a public bathroom and you don’t have to buy any books from their sale to use it.

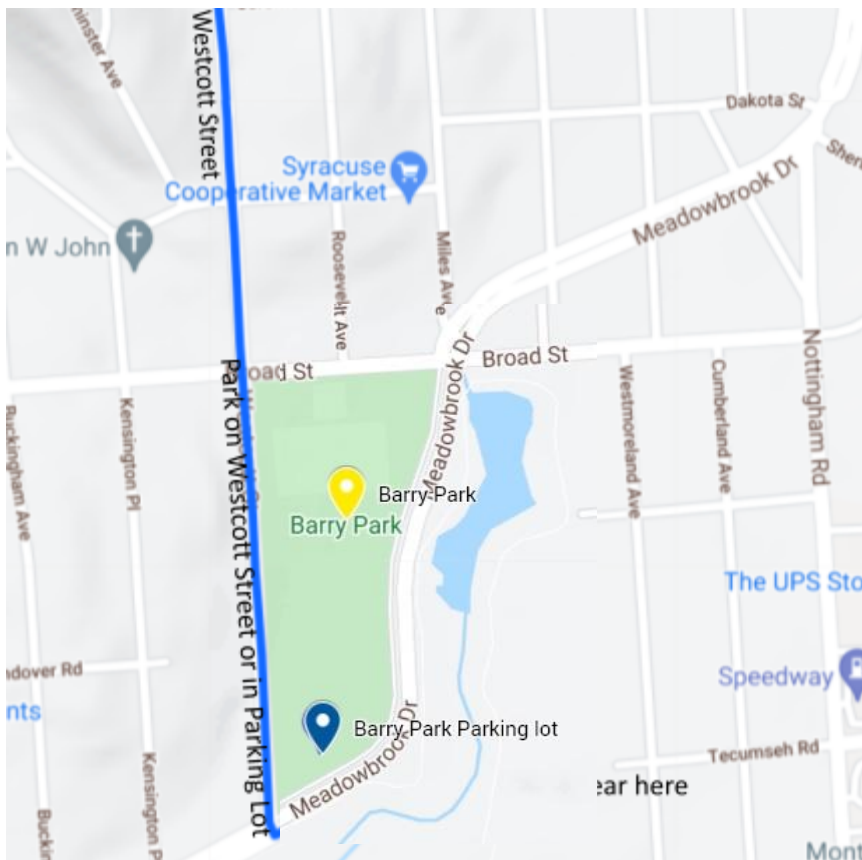
When we get to the Social/Gin & Tonic part of the schedule, you can use the bathroom at Maria Hosmer-Briggs house, but that won’t be available until 4 pm.

Second Stand, 3-4 pm: Our second stand is at Barry Park, which is also located on Westcott Street, but south of the Westcott Community Center. (The Cultural Fair is north of the Westcott Community Center). It shouldn't take more than 5 minutes to drive to Barry Park, but you will have to navigate yourself there from wherever you parked, bearing in mind that your GPS is not aware of the blocked streets.

You might think there should be working bathrooms at Barry Park, but we think the bathrooms there are NOT available.

The blue line on this map is Westcott St. The Westcott Community Center is off this map at the top (N). The Syracuse Cooperative Market is shown on this map and also the maps on p 2 and 5, to give you a common reference point and sense of scale.



Gather in the parking lot at the south end of Barry Park and follow the pack to our dance spot. We will dance from 3-4 pm, or until we decide that we've done enough.

Social Time: Gin & tonic party & dinner & singing will start when we are done dancing at Barry Park.

Location: 414 Crawford Ave.

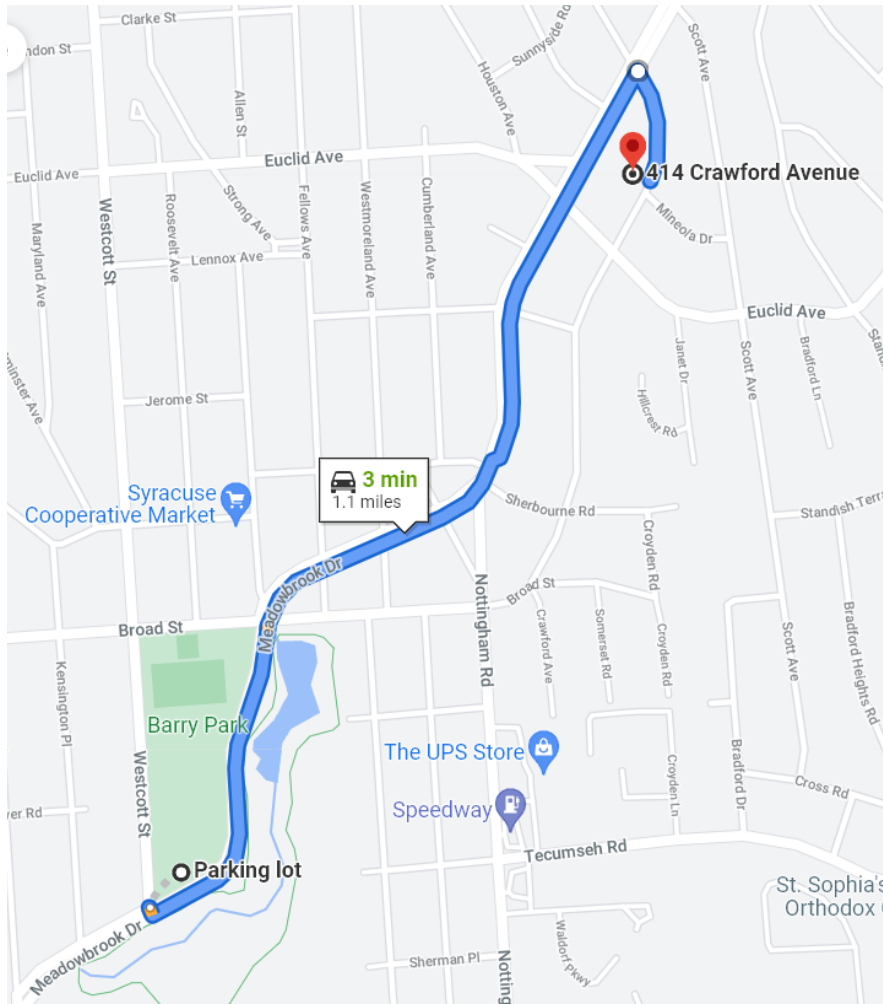
- From the Barry Park parking lot, leave through East exit, turning Left onto Meadowbrook Dr.
- If you are on Westcott Street facing South, continue to the stop sign and turn to the far left onto Meadowbrook Dr.

At the edge of Barry Park, continue straight on Meadowbrook Drive, which is a divided boulevard that winds through residential neighborhoods. Stay on Meadowbrook Drive for 1.1 miles to Crawford Ave. As you drive north on Meadowbrook Ave, Crawford Ave is the next street after you cross Euclid Ave.

- It is easy to overshoot Crawford, as there is no stop sign and there may not be a street sign.
- It's a sharp right turn, as you can see from the map.

Drive 0.1 mile and park on the right (west side), near 414 Crawford Ave. It's a narrow street. Maria asks that you be thoughtful about not blocking the neighbors' driveways.

Maria's house is brown with a dark roof. It has green hedges lining the sidewalk and driveway and there will be chairs and one or more pop-up tents in the yard.



We can use Maria's bathroom (YAY!!)

Please remove your shoes to enter Maria's house.

Enter through the back door, left up a short flight of stairs, turn right into the kitchen; keep going right to find the bathroom.
